After a lifetime of drinking . . . of losing everything dear to me . . . and of not being able to think clearly about much of anything, I have finally chosen to allow God to take control of my life. And the first step toward that new life is the time I’m spending here at Durham Rescue Mission.

For years I lived with nothing but noise in my head. I was a lost soul. But today I can say I’m like that lost sheep that was found. I’m learning what it means to have a relationship with Jesus. Lies kept me in bondage . . . but God’s truth is setting me free.

For me, one of my strongest motivations for staying sober and living God’s way is my 2-year-old granddaughter.

She was 3 months old when I first held her. That was also the *last* time I held her. But now I’m slowly being welcomed back into the family. I want to be a good grandpa . . . and with God’s help I know I will be. I’ve also graduated from the Mission’s Victory program and I know I’ll never be the same because of what I’m learning here.

I’ve never felt better in my life

Not long ago I was 220 pounds and I had a 40 inch waist. My heart was being transformed but I had to do something about how I looked. So I now walk several miles a day . . . I do 100 sit ups every morning . . . I have oatmeal and fruit for breakfast and I’ve never felt better



My name is Shaunda. If God had not directed my steps to Durham Rescue Mission I'd either be in prison — again — or dead. I was a physical and spiritual mess and I was tired of living my drug-addicted life. Down deep I knew better. But I still kept doing meth and pot for the enjoyment. But it wasn't really joyful at all. All my drug use did was to take me deeper into despair and self-loathing.

One day my husband discovered the crowd I hung out with was going to give me a *hotshot*. That's a deadly mixture of drugs designed to kill a person. My "friends"

figured I knew too much about their activities, and that it was my time to leave this world. Fortunately, I was able to escape this disaster.

Still I stayed with the drugs. I'd go without sleep for two weeks at a time. I was delirious — expecting people to attack me . . . *to say nothing of the bugs I saw on the floor that were not there*. I ached so much I thought I would die. But today I can say I am no longer the person I used to be. I've given God control of my life.

Thanks to the Mission's Victory Program, my counselors and so many Christian friends, I'm now walking a new path — God's path. Once tortured and broken in spirit, today I have a relationship with my God and a renewed bond with my husband. How grateful I am to the Mission and to you for your wonderful donations. This new 34,000-square-foot building, located on our men's campus at 1201 East Main St., will house up to 88 additional men and will be able to seat up to 250 people at meal times.
